

## **Prof. Dr. Salim CÖHCE - Curriculum Vitae**

Salim Cöhce was born in Ermenek, the city of Konya (Karaman) in 1955. He completed his primary, middle and high school education in the same town. He started working as a topographer for the state in the city of Ağrı. He graduated from the Department of History, Faculty of Letters of the Atatürk University in Erzurum in 1980. He obtained his master degree in 1982, and his Ph.D. in the same department in the field of the General Turkish History in 1986.

He started as a history teacher in Fırat university in 1985 and three years later, in 1988, he was appointed as a faculty member to the social sciences. Education Department of the Education Faculty of the İnönü University. While he was serving as a founding faculty member of this department he also held the chairmanship of the Department Atatürk Principles and Revolutionary History, İnönü University Rectorate until 1990. A year later he became associate professor. Starting from 1993, he served as a Director of the University's both the Center of Culture for three years, and between 1997-2003 the Research and Development Center of the Atatürk Principles and Revolutionary History.

He was elected as a member to the Atatürk Culture Center, Atatürk Supreme Council for Culture, Language and History in 1995. He was promoted to full professorship in 1997. He made researches and gave conferences in Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, Kirghizistan, North Cyprus Turkish Republic, Roumania, Syria, India, and Pakistan. He is also the member of the Publication committee for Armanian. Research Institute of the (ASAM) Eurasian Strategic Research Center since 1998.

Currently, he is head of the History Department at the Science-Letters Faculty, İnönü University. He has the knowledge of sufficient English, French and Persian to do research in his field. His publications include five books and more than 60 articles in the areas of Atatürk Principles and Revolutionary History, Turkish Delhi Sultanate, Eastern Turkey and Armenians.

He is married and has six children.
